- the by-laws amendment includes the option of adding two members to the School Board and that is the intent beginning in July; and two have been recruited.
- Maggie Bowles is leading a development team to do grant writing and the current focus is on funding a health clinic for the school, a second CDC playground and the gym roof.
- Kevin can give other K-8 updates and info on the Viking Challenge, School Auction and Golf Tournament
- Patty Moser could give info on current CDC happenings.

First and foremost, the congregation owes many thanks to Bob Blackwood, who is the project manager, for wrestling daily with all communications and other project issues, as the Trinity agent in dealings with the contractor and maintaining overall oversight for all aspects of this very complex project. He is on the frontline of this challenge and has been part of this effort for 4-5 years.

Similarly, Bob Meyer, has taken on the additional task of managing the building project and follow-up on the Capital Fund Drive, which is way over and above the scope of his position as Trinity financial officer.

Otherwise, recent updates include:

• the building is on schedule to be completed on June 14 (112 days) that will give Trinity 2 months to move in and get DFC approval in order to open the CDC in its new home in August, simultaneously with the 2015-16 school year and a grand ribbon-cutting/dedication ceremony.

The South roof (ie the flat roof) should be going on now, framing is 3 weeks ahead of schedule and drywall should be going in within 3 weeks.

• the TaskForce is currently looking for a project manager to oversee the gym project (which includes a new roof, new flooring, A/C work in the locker room area

and interior and exterior painting) Individuals have been asked and we are hoping to have this person in place within 2 weeks. The work needs to be completed from June 14-Aug. 14 (start of school)

- Orange house on Amelia should be demolished shortly. The first step in the teardown was the removal of asbestos shingles, which required special environmental services.
- the final house should be lowered onto its foundation within two weeks and then Doster will begin the soccer field work.
- another thanks to Bob Blackwood for arranging a contract with Landmark garage across the street for temporary parking for staff during this last phase of construction.
